Admissions

Eastbourne College offers a range of scholarships and awards, which are for entry at 13+ or 16+.

This booklet is intended to provide a summary of the various scholarships and awards which are available, for entry to the College at 13+ in Year 9. Candidates must be under 14 on 1 September 2008.

Candidates for Art, Design and Technology, Drama, Music, and Sport Awards must meet the College's normal minimum academic standards demonstrated by the Common Entrance exam or the College's own entrance tests.

A separate booklet Sixth Form Scholarships and Entry is available for 16+ entry to act as a guide for prospective parents and candidates.

Registration and Entry

Before applying for any of the scholarships listed, you will need to register by completing a registration form.

Registration can occur at any age. A completed form should be returned to the Registrar with the registration fee, currently £50.

Parents are welcome to arrange a visit to the College to meet the Headmaster, Simon Davies, be taken on a tour of the school by a pupil, and visit a House of their choice, as long as space is still available. Alternatively, parents may wish to rely on the advice of the Headmaster and Registrar to suggest the House for their child.

During the year preceding arrival, a guaranteed place form is sent to parents of a pupil who has registered. A deposit, currently £600, will be requested with the return of the form. This confirms the place, subject to satisfactory performance in the entrance exams or tests and £550 of the £600 is used as a deposit against extras throughout a pupil's time at the College. An overseas deposit, currently of £3,600, is required for pupils who have no home residence in the UK. The deposit is credited to the final account.

All pupils entering the College at 13+ will sit an entrance exam in the year of entry which will be one of

- the Independent School Education Board (ISEB) Common Academic Scholarship Examination at the College in February
- the Common Entrance Examination to independent schools at their prep school in June
- the College's own entrance tests in English, French, Mathematics, Science and verbal reasoning in March, or by individual arrangement. These are taken at the College, unless it is impractical.

Entry at 14+ and 15+ in September, or at another time in the school year, is unusual but will be considered on evidence from the Head of the previous school. Written tests may be required.

Scholarships

The College believes that the major contribution it can make to a scholar is the development of their specialism through tailored coaching and support throughout their time at the College. Awards do attract significant fee relief but the value of additional support and specialist teaching is central to what the College believes a scholarship should be. Awards are made as a result of strictly moderated open competition and assessment.

The maximum award any scholar can hold is 50% of the day or boarding fees. The majority of awards will be of between 20-40% for scholarships and 10-15% for exhibitions.

Where an applicant wins an award in more than one discipline, that applicant will receive the higher award and the title Forbes Wastie Scholar. This prestigious award will bring an additional 5-10% bonus up to the 50% maximum. The benefits of all awards won will apply.

The College is keen to stress that where parental means justify it, the fee relief component of scholarships and exhibitions may be significantly enhanced by bursaries. Financial circumstances forms are available from the Registrar or the Finance Bursar and bursaries are granted on a strictly means tested basis.

Conditions of scholarships

Candidates must be under 14 on 1 September of the year of entry.

The value of the higher or highest award will be deducted each term from the cost of the boarding or day fee as appropriate.

It is generally expected that all awards will be held for the full five years of a candidate's career at Eastbourne. All are reviewed annually. The College reserves the right to withdraw awards if, in the opinion of the Headmaster, and after careful monitoring procedures, the pupil is performing significantly below expectation.

Candidates will be judged on their merits, and the College reserves the right not to make an award if there are no candidates of sufficient merit.

Bursaries in recognition of financial need

Bursaries are separate from scholarship awards. They can be made available in exceptional and deserving cases and can add to scholarship award amounts. They are all means-tested, according to the guidelines laid down by the Charity Commission, and parents are asked to complete a financial circumstances form. Applications should be made to the Registrar in the first instance.

Academic scholarships

Eastbourne College offers a number of academic scholarships and exhibitions if candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. Entries will normally be accepted only on recommendation by the candidate's current Head.

Academic scholarships are awarded in open competition and entries must be received by 18 January 2008. They are held from the beginning of the Michaelmas term 2008 for the full five years of a candidate's career at Eastbourne, provided that the award-holder continues to show appropriate effort, enthusiasm and performance. The assessment will take place at Eastbourne College on Monday 25, Tuesday 26, and Wednesday 27 February 2008 under the joint scholarship arrangements. Accommodation can be provided if necessary. The application fee, charged by the ISEB for the joint scholarship examination, is £40, and a cheque, made payable to Eastbourne College, should accompany the application form. Awards will be announced on Friday 7 March 2008 and must be accepted within a week of the offer being received.

The following subjects will be tested: English, French, Geography, History, Latin (if studied), Mathematics, Religious Studies, Science, and there will be a general paper. Candidates can also have the option of taking a paper in German, Greek, or Spanish.

All the papers, with the exception of the general paper and the optional papers, are set as part of the ISEB common academic scholarship examination. Full details of the syllabuses and sample papers from the ISEB scheme have been sent to schools. We are not permitted to supply copies of these papers but they can be obtained from ISEB, Jordan House, Christchurch Road, New Milton, Hampshire, BH25 6QJ (01425 621111).

All academic scholars have the privilege of joining the Hayman Society, run exclusively for scholars and others in the junior part of the school who have shown the requisite scholarly acumen. The Society meets two or three times a term for discussion of a topical or controversial issue. There are plans for international visits to places of interest which may stimulate the scholars as well as a theatre trip and an annual scholars' 'thinking workshop' and dinner. In addition, candidates will benefit from a programme of support, monitoring and encouragement. Academic scholars are expected to participate actively at the top end of their classes, not only for their own benefit but for the academic benefit of those around them.

Candidates who sit the academic scholarship will normally be admitted to the College, at the Headmaster's discretion, without the need to sit the Common Entrance exam.

Art scholarships

Eastbourne College offers Art scholarships and exhibitions if candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. Entries will normally be accepted only on recommendation by the candidate's current Head.

Art scholarships are awarded in open competition and entries must be received by 18 January. They are held from the beginning of the Michaelmas term 2008 for the full five years of a candidate's career at Eastbourne, provided that the award-holder continues to show appropriate effort, enthusiasm, performance and support for the College ethos. The assessment will take place at Eastbourne College on Tuesday 5 February 2008. Awards will be announced by Friday 22 February and must be accepted within a week of the offer being received.

Successful candidates are expected to make an active contribution to school life, to study art as an academic subject, to take at least one art activity per term, and to take an active part in other art events at the College. This will be under the guidance of the Head of Art, Mr Nic Moseley. Art award winners who cease to study the subject at A level will forfeit the award. In addition to the award, candidates will receive additional tuition, free art materials and benefit from a programme of support, monitoring and encouragement.

The assessment will comprise

- an observational drawing test
- the portfolio
- a fifteen-minute interview with the Head of Art
- writing about a given work of art
- a brainstorming activity

The portfolio should contain

- drawings from direct observation that show an exceptionally mature level of skill and perception
- evidence of work that has been done over a number of weeks
- evidence of work that has been done at school with the guidance of a teacher
- at least one full sketchbook of drawings
- evidence of an interest in art that has developed over a number of years

Most of the above should have been done in the previous twelve months.

Design and Technology scholarships

Eastbourne College offers Design and Technology scholarships and exhibitions if candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. Entries will normally be accepted only on recommendation by the candidate's current Head.

Design and Technology scholarships are awarded in open competition and entries must be received by 18 January. They are held from the beginning of the Michaelmas term 2008 for the full five years of a candidate's career at Eastbourne, provided that the award-holder continues to show appropriate effort, enthusiasm, performance and support for the College ethos. The assessment will take place at Eastbourne College on Wednesday 6 February 2008. Awards will be announced by Friday 22 February and must be accepted within a week of the offer being received.

In addition candidates will benefit from a programme of support, monitoring and encouragement. It is likely that successful candidates will be entered for an Arkwright Scholarship in Year 11 and there will be extra coaching and support in preparation.

Successful candidates are expected to make an active contribution to school life, and to study Design and Technology to A level. This will be under the guidance of the Head of Design and Technology, Mr Mark Wilders. Design and Technology award winners who do not study the subject at A level will forfeit the award.

The assessment

The assessment will consist of a two-hour design test. A pre-release topic for research with additional guidance on the content of the design test will be provided. Candidates will be required to produce

- at least four alternative design solutions to the set problem
- evidence of improvement on one of the four ideas
- a final drawing of the final design with notes to show details of construction, materials and finishes

There will also be a fifteen-minute interview with the Head of Design and Technology.

Drama scholarships

Eastbourne College offers Drama scholarships and exhibitions if candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. Entries will normally be accepted only on recommendation by the candidate's current Head.

Drama scholarships are awarded in open competition and entries must be received by 18 January. They are held from the beginning of the Michaelmas term 2008 for the full five years of a candidate's career at Eastbourne, provided that the award-holder continues to show appropriate effort, enthusiasm, performance and support for the College ethos. The assessment will take place at Eastbourne College on Wednesday 6 February 2008. Awards will be announced by Friday 22 February and must be accepted within a week of the offer being received.

In addition to the award, candidates will receive free tickets to all professional drama events at College and benefit from a programme of support, monitoring and encouragement.

Successful candidates are expected to make an active contribution to school life, to study Drama to A level and to involve themselves in College productions. This will be under the guidance of the Head of Drama, Mr Tim Marriott. Drama award-winners who do not study the subject at A level will forfeit the award.

Drama at Eastbourne is an inclusive discipline, in and out of the classroom. Apart from the practical experience of bringing text to life on stage through acting and directing, expertise is also developed in a number of areas including script-writing, set-design, lighting, sound and costume. Though it is understood that most Drama scholarship candidates will offer acting as their skill, we would not want to exclude those with a particular and special talent in other areas.

The assessment for scholars will consist of

- a forty-five-minute written assessment about a recent production seen
- a one-hour assessment during which the candidate will deliver (candidates may offer both if they feel it helps them demonstrate their genuine passion for the theatre)

either (for acting candidates) a two-minute (maximum) prepared speech taken from a drama text (classical or contemporary) (not a poem) where the candidate performs in character (though not in costume)

or (for technical candidates) a presentation of evidence. This could be in the form of model-box and photographs of a set, or a costume and book containing designs and sketches, or a portfolio or DVD/video showing photographic evidence of lighting designs, or DVD/CD/video evidence of sound design

- a group improvisation where candidates will be asked to perform spontaneously to a given stimulus
- a fifteen-minute interview with the Head of Drama
- evidence of work to date (for actors: photographs and programmes of professional youth theatre or school productions) (for technical candidates: a portfolio detailing involvement in theatrical productions containing evidence in the form of designs, drawings and photographs)

Music scholarships

Eastbourne College offers Music scholarships and exhibitions if candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. Entries will normally be accepted only on recommendation by the candidate's current Head.

Music scholarships are awarded in open competition and entries must be received by 18 January. They are held from the beginning of the Michaelmas term 2008 for the full five years of a candidate's career at Eastbourne, provided that the award-holder continues to show appropriate effort, enthusiasm, performance and support for the College ethos. The assessment will take place at Eastbourne College on either Monday 28 or Tuesday 29 January 2008. Awards will be announced by Friday 22 February and must be accepted within a week of the offer being received.

In addition to the award, candidates will receive free music tuition on two instruments (which can include singing), benefit from a programme of support, monitoring and encouragement and also have the guidance of a specialist music tutor.

Successful candidates are expected to make an active and positive contribution to the musical life of the school, both as a soloist and in ensemble work with, for example, choirs, orchestras and productions. Music scholars are expected to study Music as an academic subject and should continue to contribute fully to the extra-curricular music at the College if they do not study the subject formally at A level. This will be under the guidance of the Director of Music, Mr Graham Jones. An Organ scholarship is available. This position gives valuable experience in service and choir accompaniment in Chapel with the possibility of playing during Cathedral visits.

A scholarship candidate would normally be expected to offer two instruments, one of which may be singing, or two instruments together with singing. The experience of choristers studying at schools affiliated to the Choir Schools Association is welcomed. Choral awards can be made to those who offer singing as a first instrument.

The examination will consist of

- two prepared pieces on first instrument (Grade V would be expected for entry at 13, although a candidate below this standard who shows promise may be considered)
- one prepared piece on second instrument
- a sight-reading test
- an aural test
- an interview with the Head of Music

Candidates will be expected to discuss their musical studies and interests, including their involvement in musical groups and activities. They should provide references testifying to their musical abilities.

Candidates are welcome to bring their own accompanist to the examination or supply us with copies of the music in advance.

The Nigel Wheeler Sport Scholarship

Eastbourne College offers Sport scholarships and exhibitions if candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. Entries will normally be accepted only on recommendation by the candidate's current Head. These scholarships are named for what Nigel Wheeler has stood for in his thirty years as master in charge of cricket at the College. His values and qualities are the values and qualities that we believe to be central to the Eastbourne ethos:

Eastbourne believes in team sports; in trying one's best and improving one's skill and technique as best one can; in tough competition; in being a competitor; we believe in grace in victory or defeat, in immaculate and courteous behaviour as visitor or guest; in generous hospitality and fun.

The Nigel Wheeler sports awards aims to inspire a similar philosophy of sport in future generations of Eastbournians and inspire former generations of OEs to wish to involve themselves with the project.

Sport scholarships are awarded in open competition and entries must be received by 18 January. They are held from the beginning of the Michaelmas term 2008 for the full five years of a candidate's career at Eastbourne, provided that the award-holder continues to show appropriate effort, enthusiasm, performance and support for the College ethos. The assessment will take place at Eastbourne College on Monday 4 February 2008. Awards will be announced by Friday 22 February and must be accepted within a week of the offer being received.

As part of the award, successful candidates will join the sport scholars mentoring programme, which will include personal monitoring, support and specialist coaching. Scholars will also be entitled to apply for additional financial assistance to help meet the costs of personal equipment and/or development courses.

Successful candidates may well have performed at representative level in their chosen sport. They are expected to show leadership and to make an active and full contribution to the sporting life of the College in at least two of the three terms, contributing not only in terms of their individual performance as a member of school teams but also as role models in their attitude and behaviour as sportsmen and sportswomen. Time off College commitments will be provided to attend representative trials.

Applicants must excel in at least one of our major sports which, for boys, are cricket, hockey, and rugby, and, for girls, hockey, netball and tennis. Other sports will be considered on a discretionary basis and can also be used to strengthen an application. Sports should be written in priority order i.e. strongest sport first.

Application procedure

- candidates must be specifically proposed and recommended by the sports staff and Head of the candidate's current school (i.e. parents cannot make an independent application)
- candidates should complete their own sporting CV, validated by the Head or a coach at their current school, listing the teams and squads in which they have participated, both in and out of school. Details of achievements and representative honours should be included. This should be submitted well in advance of the deadline to enable the College to make arrangements to see applicants playing, prior to assessment. This may mean CVs are sent in during the summer term of the previous academic year, but, in any event, by half term in October
- candidates should state their choice of sport(s) to be assessed, up to a maximum of two, on the entry form on page 25
- candidates are expected to show that they are familiar with current issues regarding their own sports in particular and sport in general

References

Detailed reports on the candidate's ability will be sought from the pupil's current Head and coaches, where reference should be made to the candidate's ability, potential, commitment, attendance record and self-discipline.

Forbes Wastie Awards

Boys and girls who show exceptional talent and promise in more than one area deserve to be publicly recognised as outstanding. Eastbourne College will make a special award, known as a Forbes Wastie Award (in recognition of a distinguished and long-serving College Deputy Head), to pupils who are assessed as scholarship standard in more than one area. This award is made at the discretion of the Headmaster, to a candidate or candidates who have excelled in at least two areas of scholarship. Mr Wastie himself was a renaissance man who excelled in a number of different fields. This award will be in addition to the value of the higher of the individual scholarship awards, subject to the overall College maximum award of 50%. Forbes Wastie Awards of up to 10% will be made to those who achieve scholarship standard in two areas. Those who hold a Forbes Wastie Award will have the same expectations and provision in each of their disciplines as individual award-holders, although they will be carefully monitored to ensure that they are challenged but not excessively so. It is expected that they will stand out as leaders among their peers, and they will be supported in this role.

Awards will be announced on Friday 7 March 2008 and must be accepted within a week of the offer being received.
