
















































Inter house sport

While it was disappointing that Gonville were unable to compete in the Senior Football, there was plenty of other inter-house sport this term. The year 9 and 10 did manage to compete in their respective football competitions experiencing the standard mix of elation and last-minute heartbreak. In year 9 **Oliver Du Feu** was a constant threat upfront, **Oliver Rose** showed some excellent touches in midfield and **William Daniels** found his niche as rush goalie. Sadly two members of the year group were not present, but the other 7 coped manfully and finished 5th.

Our year 10 footballers were competitive from the outset with **Elombe Case** very solid in goal, **Zac Crowe** a live-wire and **Herbie Flint** showing great distribution. A last minute goal from Wargrave robbed them of a memorable win, but they did record good wins against Craig and Pennell and finished 3rd overall.

The house swimming competition saw Gonville turn the pool pink with some very fine swimming and some very gutsy performances by those who do not usually get in the pool. The senior team was lead by **George Pepper** who won the first race (50m Freestyle), getting us off to the best possible start. **William Reeves, Henry Drew, James Nicholas, Jago Goodsell** and the impressive **Elliot Jones** made up the rest of the team. Overall they found themselves in 4th place. The junior team of **William Daniels, Elombe Case, Will Lominchar Ormeño, Feliz Ng** and **Oliver Du Feu** also finished 4th showing great spirit to compete in every event and, on occasion, swim strokes that did not suit them. A great experience for all those who competed and I will look forward to this next year when the rest of the house might be able to turn out in support. Special mention to **Rupert Plumptre** who operated effectively as team manager.

House hockey was also contested at Junior (year 9 and 10) and Senior (Year 11 and 6th form). In the juniors Luke Clifford, Zac Crowe, Oliver Du Feu and Elombe Case provided the spine of this side, but all others played a part in the teams success. Denziel Armah was very solid in goal and was really unlucky to concede a last second winner against Craig from a short corner. Overall they finished 5th. The senior squad had a 2nd XI player in Tawanda Muyeye, a 3rd XI in Shintaro Hashimoto and two 4th XI in William Reeves and Jago Goodsell. With no other hockey players the sensible move would have been to forfeit and not take part, but the house was adamant that a team would be fielded. Henry Drew, James Nicholas, Rupert Plumptre and Victor Chan stepped up to the plate and into the firing line. A couple of glorious defeats showed the early signs of promise. Rupert Plumptre was rediscovering his touch from year 10, Henry Drew was learning not to use his feet and Shintaro made one world class save from a fierce drag flick (not something often seen in 3rd XI matches). Next up were Wargrave who had a host of 1st team stars including the school's international prospect. Gonville had the gall to score a goal. An Exocet from Tawanda Muyeye at a short corner. Sadly this awakened the beast a little and the remainder of the game was a little one sided. Finally, Gonville played Powell. Once

again Powell had all 1st and 2nd team hockey players and our motley crew were beginning to show fatigue. An early break was finished by **Rupert Plumptre** and then it was just a case of holding out for glory. A 1-0 win that will forever show that forfeiting is not an option and that if you are on the field you have a chance.

Squash saw **Edward Rowell** and **William Daniels** for the juniors and **Mark Burnham** and **Jago Goodsell** for the seniors. Some very competitive games were played as every point counted. 








The end of Year II mocks was celebrated with a dinner themed '007'. It was great to see the lads scrub up well and have a celebration at the end of a tough couple of weeks.








