Captain of tennis and number one Eastbourne seed Bella Moen took the Under 18 Independent Schools title with Sasha Rozanov. Both played brilliantly in the interhouse, but had to concede defeat to School House tennis scholars-you don't normally get that level of play on Beresford on a Saturday afternoon! Elo, Liza, Sacha, Savannah, Lilv Haussermann have represented the College at senior level, with Alisa Maksidova, Daisy Quitmann and Izzie Steed emerging as future stars. Savannah, Sacha and Alisa have also been ball-girling at the tennis this week, with Savanah and Sacha on centre court and Sacha making her debut on BBC 2.
