The Post

Eastbourne College Incorporated (ECi or 'the Charity') comprises St Andrew's Prep ages 9 months to 13 years and Eastbourne College, ages 13-18 years, co-ed day and boarding schools.

Eastbourne College Incorporated (ECi) seeks to appoint a Marketing Coordinator, reporting to the ECi Campaign and Marketing lead (CML), the primary role will be to support the CML across their remit, and take responsibility of marketing initiatives.

Supporting across St Andrew's Prep and Eastbourne College this is a full time, all year around role to maximise output and recruitment of families.

Duties and Responsibilities

Campaign management

- Support the CML in the rollout of campaign material

Brand touchpoints

- Support the CML in the roll out of our brand across all touchpoints; from facilities to customer literature
- Should the ECi Social Media Coordinator not be available, responsible for the social content distribution across the charity

Customer Communications

- Responsible for the creation and distribution of routine customer communications eg weekly / termly newsletters
- Responsible for the creation of the Androvia, with input from other team members

Events

- Help with the delivery of smaller events pending the Event Coordinators capacity / availability

PR

- Responsible for the management and updating of all educational directories

Budget

- Responsible for day-to-day management of the marketing budget

Other

- Monitor competitor landscape and report findings back to team
- Together with the Content Creator, ensure the photographic library is up to date
- Assisting the CML with required website updates
- Assisting with adhoc requests eg business cards

Terms and Conditions

Salary: £25k per annum dependent on experience

Hours of Work: 37.5 hours per week per week, normally 9.00am to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday, all year round. Flexibility is required from time to time including out of hours events which will require occasional attendance evenings and weekends. Time off in lieu will be given.

Pension: Pension: After three months' service you may be automatically enrolled into the Eastbourne College WorkSave Pension Scheme (details are available from the HR Department), depending on your level of earnings, however you may also choose to opt in to the pension scheme. The Charity will contribute 5% of your gross salary and you must also contribute 3%. You may choose to opt out of the pension scheme.

There is a non-contractual paid break over the Christmas period which is at the discretion of the Chief Operating Officer dependent on when Christmas and New Year falls where there is no requirement to work.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Eastbourne College Incorporated (ECi)

Eastbourne College Incorporated is the term for the combination of Eastbourne College and St. Andrew's Prep School. The two schools are run separately but are part of the same Charity and a single Board of Governors bears overall responsibility. The post-holder will be expected to work across both schools.

The College

Eastbourne College is a co-educational HMC independent school of just over 630 pupils, of whom half are full-time boarders. It is a strong community with excellent links with local schools and the remarkable town in which it is located.

Academic standards are very high with an average of 85% of A-level grades being awarded A*, A or B in the last four years. At GCSE approximately two thirds of all grades awarded are A* or A. The College recruits from a wide ability range and value added outcomes are exemplary. The majority of College leavers enter higher education in leading universities at home or abroad.

The College is run as a full boarding school with a six-day per week academic and co-curricular timetable. Day pupils share the same wide curriculum as boarders and enjoy equal access to the physical and human resources of the school.

We are proud of our rich cultural and sporting traditions. The modern Birley Centre is a hub of the performing arts and has a performance space ideal for debating events. There is also a school theatre that can hold a large audience, a drama studio space, and other spaces conducive to debating and public speaking workshops for smaller groups. College artists exhibit in London, actors have starred in film and TV; the Design & Technology (DT) department wins an extraordinary number of Arkwright scholarships. We have an enviable reputation for sport both regionally and nationally. Eastbournians frequently represent the county in hockey, rugby, cricket and netball; several old Eastbournians have gone on to achieve international honours. There are also thriving Combine Cadet Force, Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme and Service at School (S@S) programmes.

As we celebrated our 150th year, the College completed the most ambitious development project in its history. Project 150 saw the delivery of over 30 state of the art classrooms, ICT suites, a new swimming pool, café, school shop, dance studio, sports hall, squash courts, dining hall and fitness suite. We believe that the College has some of the best facilities of any school in the UK.

Eastbourne College places great emphasis on the importance of developing a school in which education is built on core values and positive, supportive relationships. These central qualities will endure long after a student moves on from the College. The five key values of participation, the pursuit of excellence, integrity, courtesy and kindness are, it believes, the bedrock upon which every child's education should stand, providing them with the wherewithal to flourish both at school and beyond.

St. Andrew's Prep

Founded in 1877 and home to 360+ pupils from 9 months to 13 years, St Andrew's is a non-selective co-education IAPS prep school which prides itself on breadth and excellence. Most are day pupils but 25 to 30 boarders live within the heart of the school with space for a further 20 flexi boarders – a facility used by a large number of children over the course of the year.

The school is set in twelve acres of sports fields. The beach is a five-minute stroll away and a number of classrooms overlook the sea and the South Downs. With nature on its front door, St Andrew's offers unique Forest and Beach Schools which provide opportunities to complement classroom study with outdoor learning.

St Andrew's Prep's sporting pedigree is excellent with representatives winning medals at many county, regional, national and occasional international event across the sports of Rugby, Football, Cricket, Athletics, Hockey, Tennis and Netball. However, there are teams for every ability ensuring that each child represents the school. The school has an impressive sports hall and the recently refurbished Fives court has just re-opened. DT, Art, Drama and Music are of an exceptional standard. Recent LAMDA results have been outstanding and many of our musicians (80% of the pupils play an instrument) reach the higher ABRSM grades.

After-school and optional Saturday morning activities are numerous and varied and include, among many others, golf, jazz dance, pot throwing, steel drums, shooting, water polo, mountain biking and fencing. The school has its own Community award which aims to nurture confidence and independence, develop a breadth of interest in each child and create a stronger sense of identity and community.

St Andrew's amalgamated with Eastbourne College in 2010. The two schools retain a good deal of independence and their own identities, but share some facilities and support staff and are working to establish strong interdependent links which will benefit the education of the children within the wider charity.
