

## **More Individual Sporting Success**

Hattie Stone (Year 9) competed in the Swimming Counties over two weekends in February. She achieved outstanding results, with some PBs along the way and is now overall Junior Champion, as well as U15 winner of: 50m Fly, 100m Fly, 50m Breaststroke, 100m Breaststroke and 100m Freestyle.
