## **Sporting Highlights**

The girls have been training hard since they arrived back in house in January. As well as competing in House events, we have had Blackwater representation across sports for the College.

Our 1st VII netball squad reached the Sussex semi-finals which include **Hannah Duke and Pheobe Wearne**. The U16As made the final of the Sussex bowl with the U15As winning the Sussex plate for the first Sussex netball silverware beating Brighton College in the final. This included Blackwater representation from **Lucy McDonald, Scarlett McFarlane, Annie Lewis, Ella Helm, Juliette Tapner and Eloise Garton.** The U14As & 15As won more games than they conceded, and it has been superb reward for the effort in training. There has also been the continued success of the weekly adult Eastbourne Netball league.

Our equestrian team qualified again for the national finals, including **Darcy Dumas, Meg Lillicrap and Lola Woollard**; the cross-country team competed in the Sussex Champs with some going to race in the regional and national finals.

Well done to **Emma Valks** who was part of the Girls' Senior Tennis Team who won the LTA winter Schools competition in the regional finals held at Sutton Tennis Centre.

The girls' fives teams competed in the southeast regional competitions. The girls qualified brilliantly for the national finals with cup and plate singles and doubles winners and runners up in an impressive return. **Ameilia Williams** in Year 13 was part of the doubles plate winning team, **Scarlett McFarlane** achieved runner up in the main singles competition, with **Ella Helm** taking Gold. **Scarlett and Ella** also won the doubles plate. **Stuti Vasdev and Aless Kasar** in year 9 went on to the National Finals to achieve 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

**Bbelle Gorrill** took part in the Biathlon, returning from the national finals with a silver medal for the girls.

Records fell for our swim team at the national 150 school Bath Cup at the Olympic Park. With the boys completing a unique double-double gold retaining two national titles and setting national records along the way. Our girls (including **Bbelle Gorrill**) also achieved an amazing haul of two silver medals. In the schools super league they secured a bronze overall and won the senior boys and inter girls. A just reward for the impressive early morning and evening sessions they complete.

Jessie Holgate, Eloise Garton and Ella Helm all continue to represent Sussex County in Hockey.

The U16 Eastbourne Hockey Club team - consisting of Emma Valks, Eloise Garton, Scarlett McFarlane, Ella Helm, Jessie Holgate and Bbelle Gorrill - made it to the national plate final in Nottingham. The came away from the final with a silver medal. A great achievement to make it to the national final. Well done to you all.

This term the girls have competed and showed true team spirit and loyalty in the House netball, squash, football and basketball. A busy month with some great wins for the house.



#### **CCF, DofE and Service Report**

Twenty-eight Y12's and thirty-nine Y10's attended their first training day on Sunday 23rd in preparation for their practice, in the summer term. Many of those included girls from Blackwater House. Seventy pupils have completed the award over the last year. Twenty-two of which were golds, a massive achievement for our college and punching well above our weight. Forty-seven silvers and one bronze also completed their awards, another great success for the college. We are pleased to announce that **Harinee Satish** have been selected for the DofE Young Leaders Programme and have enrolled on it.

Members of the CSP homework clubs, mainly in our Year 12s, have been supporting pupils at local secondary schools with preparation for the maths and languages GCSEs and Literacy Club mentors have been helping younger pupils from Eastbourne Academy with reading and comprehension skills. Visitors to the Chaseley Trust have been involved in social and craft activities and physiotherapy programmes with severely disabled adults, who have also enjoyed musical performances from talented College violinists. Wednesday Club helpers have been serving up afternoon tea, bingo and quizzes to local elderly residents and a small team has helped to maintain wheelchairs for the Shopmobility service in the Beacon Centre. The Green Teams have been carrying out beach cleaning operations and a recycling service across the College campus.

A group of Year 11 and Year 12 pupils have been developing their coaching skills during cricket service. They have been creating short videos on different drills and techniques of skills for younger students to learn from while also enhancing their understanding of effective session planning.

The Army section's highlight was an overnight voluntary exercise where cadets demonstrated impressive self-sufficiency and weapons handling skills. Year 11 cadets undertook the Cadet Forces Instructional Techniques course, balancing it with GCSE pressures.

The RAF section saw cadets participate in their first Air Experience Flight at RAF Benson and receive weapons training. Year 11 cadets continued their leading cadet and Methods of Instruction courses, with several receiving awards

The CCF term closed with its splendid annual formal dinner to thank all senior cadets and adult volunteers, including our very own **Tilly Lancaster**.
